

CHAPTER 75—S. F. No. 738.

An Act to amend Section 1228 Revised Laws 1905, relating to road labor and providing for the amount to be allowed in commutation of road taxes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Commutation for labor shall be \$2 per day.**—That Section 1228 of the Revised Laws of 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

“Section 1228. The overseer shall give at least three days’ notice to all persons assessed for road labor, of the time and place when and where they shall appear for work, and with what teams or tools. Such persons may appear personally or by able-bodied substitutes, or they may elect to commute for the same or some part thereof. Commutation for labor shall be at the rate of *two dollars* per day, to be paid to the overseer within two days after notice to appear for work. Each able-bodied man shall be allowed for labor *two dollars* per day, and the like amount for the use of a team and a wagon, plow or scraper.”

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 76—S. F. No. 65.

An Act to amend Section 2391, of Chapter 39, of Revised Laws of Minnesota 1905, relating to tree bounties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Tree bounty for trees grown on timber as well as prairie land.**—That Section 2391, of Chapter 39, of Revised Laws of Minnesota 1905, be amended so as to read as follows:

“Section 2391. Every person who shall plant one acre or more of () land with forest trees of any kind other than black locust, and shall keep such trees growing in a thrifty condition, and not more than twelve feet apart either way, replacing yearly such as may die, shall receive from the state two dollars and fifty cents per acre therefor for six successive years, not exceeding, however, twenty-five dollars in any one year. This section shall not apply to any railway company, to any person who has already received such compensation, nor to any person planting trees in compliance with an act of Congress approved March 3, 1873, relating to the growth of timber on western prairies, or any act amendatory thereof. For the

purpose of paying such compensation, the sum of twenty thousand dollars is annually appropriated from the revenue fund."

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 77—H. F. No. 258.

An Act permitting counties having a population of less than 200,000 people to appropriate money for the purpose of advertising the agricultural resources of such counties, and paying such money to incorporated development societies.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **County commissioners may appropriate money for advertising agricultural resources.**—The board of county commissioners of any county in this state having less than 200,000 inhabitants, may by unanimous vote appropriate annually out of the general revenue fund of such county, a sum of money not exceeding a sum equal to five cents per capita of the population of such county, according to the last census, either federal or state, of such county. Such sum so appropriated shall be paid to any incorporated development society or organization of this state which in the opinion of the board of county commissioners will use such money for the best interests of such county in advertising the agricultural resources of such county, and such other matter as may tend to a development of the county.

CHAPTER 78—H. F. No. 157.

An Act to amend Section One Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Five (1995), Revised Laws, 1905, relating to construction and maintenance of public highways, streets, and sidewalks crossing the right of way of railroads in this state.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Railroad companies to construct sidewalks at crossings in municipalities.**—That Section One Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety-Five (1995) Revised Laws of 1905, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:
