

CHAPTER 321—H. F. No. 622.

An act to amend Section 3858, General Statutes 1913, relating to assignments, sales and transfers of wages or salary.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **When assignment sale or transfer of wage or salary is not to be effective.**—That section 3858, General Statutes 1913, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

3858. No assignment, sale or transfer, however made or attempted to be made, of any wages or salary, to be earned, shall give any right of action, either at law or in equity, to the assignee or transferee of such wages or salary, nor shall any action lie for the recovery of such wages or salary, or any part thereof, by any other person than the person to whom such wages or salary are to become due, unless a written notice, together with a true and complete copy of the instrument assigning or transferring such wages or salary, shall have been given within three days after the making of such instrument to the person, firm or corporation from whom such wages or salary are accruing, or may accrue.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 322—H. F. No. 630.

An act to amend Section 17 of Chapter 204, General Laws of Minnesota 1905, relating to the sale of timber on state lands, defining trespass thereon and prescribing penalties therefor.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Annual and emergency sales of timber on state lands.**—That section 17, chapter 204, General Laws of 1905, be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 17. Except as provided in this and the preceding section, there shall be only one sale of timber in each year, which shall be held not later than November 1st, and may be adjourned from day to day, but no longer, until complete; provided, that in case of emergency, if the board of timber commissioners shall unanimously determine that it is for the best interests of the state that *more sales* shall take place before the next regular sale, *they* shall be held under the same regulations, so far as practicable, as are provided for regular sales.
