CHAPTER 181—S. F. No. 763

An act to prohibit peddling, canvassing or soliciting within school buildings or on school grounds and providing penalties for violations thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Peddling and canvassing prohibited on school grounds.—No person shall offer for sale, sell or peddle any goods, wares, books, newspapers, magazines or merchandise, insurance, course of instruction or any other thing whatsoever, or canvass or take orders therefor, or solicit the endorsement of any goods, wares, books, newspapers, magazines, merchandise, insurance or course of instruction or other thing in any public school building or upon any public school grounds not located within the limits of any city, village or borough whether or not such person has a license to offer for sale, sell, solicit or canvass for such goods, wares, books, newspapers, magazines, merchandise, insurance, course of instruction or any other thing whatsoever; provided this act shall not be construed as prohibiting the soliciting of or taking of such orders from, or making such sale to the school board or any member thereof, the board of education or any member thereof, or the superintendent of schools.

Sec. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 182—S. F. No. 792

An act providing for the apportionment to the proper ditch fund of counties of all interest and penalties collected on delinquent ditch assessments.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Disposition of penalties and interest on ditch assessments.—All interest and penalties accruing upon any tax levied by special assessment on real estate for drainage purposes where such assessments are payable to the county ditch fund shall be apportioned to such county ditch fund and credited to the particular drainage project for which such assessment was made.
