

title to any tract of land not exceeding *forty acres* in area which he deems necessary or convenient for the use of the state as locations for watch towers, warehouses, or other buildings of any kind, or for any other use in connection with his duties as commissioner of forestry and fire prevention.

**Sec. 2. Commissioner of forestry may purchase lands.**—That Section 2 of Laws 1927, Chapter 329, be and the same hereby is amended so as to read as follows:

“Sec. 2. That said commissioner of forestry and fire prevention, department of conservation, is also authorized, on behalf of the State of Minnesota, to purchase small tracts or parcels of land not exceeding *five acres* in area, nor costing more than *\$50.00* for any single tract, to be used as locations for watch towers, warehouses, or other buildings of any kind, or for any other use in connection with his duties as commissioner of forestry and fire prevention—also to acquire by condemnation any tract of land not exceeding *five acres* in area for said purposes; also to acquire by gift, purchase, or condemnation any easement or right-of-way that may be necessary to provide access to any tract of land acquired under this act.

“Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.”

#### CHAPTER 221—S. F. No. 444

*An act to appropriate money for the current expenses, buildings and improvements at State Institutions, for expenses of the State Board of Control and certain activities under the supervision or control of said board, and for other purposes; to appropriate money from the State Prison Revolving Fund for current expenses, buildings and improvements at the State Prison; to authorize the transfer of funds in certain cases; to extend balances of appropriations heretofore made; and to authorize the executive council to borrow money in certain cases.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

**Section 1. Appropriation for state institutions.**—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated to be expended by the state board of control for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act, to be available at the time designated opposite each item.

Provided further, that said board may, without such consent and approval of the auditor, use the balance of any appropriation made for a specific purpose at any institution for any other specific purpose in and about such institution after the purpose for which such appropriation was made has been accomplished; and

Provided further, that said board is hereby authorized and empowered to set aside a portion of the current expense fund of any such institution to be used as a diversified labor fund for the introduction and encouragement of such industries as in its judgment may be beneficial to the inmates of such institution.

#### Sec. 20. State Prison:

The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury to the credit of the state prison revolving fund to be expended by the state board of control for the purposes specified in this section, to be available at the time designated opposite each item.

Sec. 21. **Unexpended balances reappropriated.**—The unexpended balances on hand June 30, 1929, in the several appropriations for each and all of the institutions hereinbefore named, the state board of control and the several divisions and activities of said board are hereby reappropriated for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1930 and June 30, 1931, and where an appropriation is made in this act and there remains a balance in a previous appropriation made for the same purpose, such balance shall be added to and become a part of such appropriation.

Sec. 22. **Executive council may borrow money.**—Whenever it becomes necessary, in order to meet the current demands upon the revenue fund for the payment of appropriations, the executive council, may, at any time prior to June 30, 1931, make such agreement with banks or other corporations or persons as they may deem advisable or necessary to pay warrants issued against said revenue fund pursuant to any such appropriation prior to the time when the money to meet such appropriation comes into the state treasury, and whenever any warrants so issued are paid for the accommodation of the state the money necessary to pay interest upon the amounts of such warrants from the time when such payment was made until the money to redeem such warrants comes into the state treasury, at the rate agreed upon by the said executive council, is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 23. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

#### CHAPTER 222—H. F. No. 76

*An act to amend Section 2328, General Statutes 1923, relating to mortgage registration tax.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:
