CHAPTER 424—H. F. No. 518

An act relating to the admission of attorneys at law to practice in Minnesota.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Admission to practice at law of certain persons.— Any person who has studied law in the office of a practicing attorney of this State for a period of at least three years in compliance with the rules of the State Board of Bar Examiners in force at the time of such study and who has been a student in the Academic College of the University of Minnesota for a period of more than one year and who has served in the military or naval forces of the United States during the World War and received an honorable discharge therefrom and who was disabled therein or thereby within the purview of the Act of Congress approved June 7th, 1924, known as "World War Veteran's Act, 1924" and whose disability is rated at least ten per cent thereunder at the time of the passage of this act, shall on motion before the Supreme Court upon proof of such facts and that he is an adult resident of the State of Minnesota of good moral character, recommended by two district judges of this State, be admitted to practice law without examination upon payment of the usual fee for such examination.

CHAPTER 425-H. F. No. 1113

An act relating to the inspection, analysis and standardization of gasoline, kerosene, furnace oils and lubricating oils used, stored, held for sale, or sold within this state; regulating the sale and distribution thereof; authorizing the collection of inspection fees and providing for the disposition thereof; providing for the enforcement of this act and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof; creating an oil inspection division and prescribing the powers and duties of the head of such division.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Definitions.—Unless the language or context clearly indicates that a different meaning is intended the following words and terms shall, for the purpose of this act, be given the meaning hereinafter subjoined to them.
