- Sec. 33. Unexpended balances reappropriated.—The unexpended balances on June 30, 1929, in the several appropriations here-tofore made to the departments and activities named in this act are hereby reappropriated and made available for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1930, and June 30, 1931, respectively, for the purposes for which such appropriations were made. Where an appropriation is made in this act and there remains a balance in a previous appropriation for the same purpose, such balance shall be added to and become a part of such appropriation, except as herein otherwise specifically provided.
- Sec. 34. Counties to receive their share of inheritant tax.— The state auditor and state treasurer are hereby authorized to pay to the county treasuries of the several counties of the state on or before November 1, 1930 and 1931, the amounts due the respective counties as their share of the state inheritance tax under the provisions of Section 21-D, Chapter 209, General Laws 1911, and acts amendatory thereof.
- Sec. 35. Executive council may borrow fund.—Whenever it becomes necessary in order to meet the current demands upon the revenue funds for the payment of appropriations, the executive council may, at any time, prior to June 30, 1931, make such agreement with banks or other corporations or persons as they may deem advisable and necessary to pay warrants issued against said revenue fund, pursuant to any such appropriation prior to the time when the money to meet such appropriation comes into the state treasury and whenever any warrants are so issued for the accommodation of the state, and paid, the money necessary to pay interest upon the amount of such warrants from the time when such payment was made until the money to redeem such warrants comes into the state treasury at the rate agreed upon by said executive council is hereby appropriated.
- Sec. 36. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 427-S. F. No. 1246

An act to appropriate money for the payment of claims against the State of Minnesota; to provide for tax and other refundments; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of certain em-

ployees of the state having claims for personal injuries sustained or for loss or damage of property incurred while engaged in the performance of their duties and for the relief of dependents of certain employees of the state for the death of such employees while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for the reimbursement and compensation of persons for injuries sustained or for loss or damage to property by certain employees of the state while engaged in the performance of their duties; and by immates of state institutions; and for the relief of dependents of certain persons for the death of such persons caused by acts of certain employees of the state while engaged in the performance of their duties; to provide for repairs to and maintenance and completion of state armories; to provide for payments to certain persons for services performed to the state: to authorize the state auditor to cancel certain land and other contracts heretofore entered into by certain persons with the state and to credit payments heretofore made upon other purchases or to refund the same; to reimburse certain persons for deeds to certain land erroneously conveyed by the state; to authorize the auditor to credit on certain land contracts the value of improvements found not to be on said land; to provide money for carrying on certain state activities as authorized by law and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriations for miscellaneous claims.—The sums hereinafter named or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified in the following sections of this act to be available June 30, 1929, unless otherwise specified.
