county treasury. The clerk of the district court shall deliver to each juror a certificate for the number of days' attendance and miles traveled for which he is entitled to compensation. Talesmen actually serving upon any petit jury shall receive the sum of \$3.00 per day.

Sec. 2. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 124-S. F. No. 1203

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 3728, relating to service pension.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. 'Service pension.—That Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 3728, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"3728. Every fire department relief association organized under any laws of this state, whenever its certificate of incorporation or by-laws so provide, may pay out of any funds received from the state, or other source, a service pension, in such amount, not exceeding \$40.00 per month, as hereinafter authorized, or as may be provided by its by-laws, to each of its members, who have heretofore retired or may hereafter retire, who has reached or shall hereafter reach the age of 50 years, and who has done, or hereafter shall do. active duty for 20 years or more as a member of a volunteer paid, or partially paid and partially volunteer fire department in the municipality where such association exists, and who has been, or shall hereafter be, a member of such fire department relief association at least 10 years prior to such retirement, and who complies with such additional conditions as to age, service, and membership as may be prescribed by the certificate or by-laws of such association.

The amount of monthly pension which may be paid to such retired firemen may be increased by adding to the maximum above prescribed, an amount not exceeding two dollars per month for each year of active duty over 20 years of service before retirement, provided, however, that no such fire department relief association shall pay to any member thereof a pension in any greater amount than the sum of \$60.00 per month. Such pensions shall be uniform in amount, except as herein otherwise provided. No such pension shall be paid to any person while he remains a member of the fire

department and no person receiving such pension shall be entitled to other relief from such association. No payments made or to be made by said association to any member on the pension roll shall be subject to judgment, garnishment or execution, or other legal process, and no person entitled to such payment shall have the right to assign the same, nor shall the association have the authority to recognize any assignment or pay over any sum which has been assigned.

Sec. 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage."

CHAPTER 125—S. F. No. 1456

An act legalizing certain tax levies heretofore made.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Tax levies validated.—In all counties in this State where the tax levies for general revenue purposes, levied for the year 1932 and collectible in the year 1933, exceed existing limitations, such levies are hereby approved, legalized and made valid.

CHAPTER 126-H. F. No. 1667

An act appropriating \$35,000.00 to the Board of Control for the purpose of providing hay and feed for livestock in drought stricken areas of this State.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriation for drouth sufferers.—There is hereby appropriated out of moneys in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of \$35,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, payable to the State Board of Control, for the purpose of being used by said Board of Control to carry on the activity through the Agricultural Department in caring for and providing feed for livestock in drought stricken areas of this State. That the distribution of said funds by said Board of Control be used and distributed through the agencies and activities now carrying on the work of giving aid to farmers in those counties where there is imminent danger of cattle and livestock suffering on account of provisions to feed them with.
