Sec. 5. **Application.**—Provisions of this act shall in no manner apply to the state highway department or any of its employes.

Sec. 6. This Act shall take effect upon its passage.

CHAPTER 162—H. F. No. 804

An act to appropriate money for the current expenses, buildings and improvements at State Institutions, for expenses of the State Board of Control and certain activities under the supervision or control of said board, and for other purposes; to appropriate money from the State Prison Revolving Fund for current expenses and improvements at the State Prison; to authorize the transfer of funds in certain cases; reducing certain salaries and directing the State Board of Control to make such salary reductions effective; to extend balances of appropriations heretofore made and to authorize the executive council to borrow money in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Appropriation for current expenses, etc.**—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated to be expended by the State Board of Control for the purposes specified in the following sections of this Act, to be available at the time designated opposite each item.

Provided that for the years ending June 30, 1934 and June 30, 1935; respectively, the State Board of Control is authorized, by and with the approval of the State Auditor, to transfer in cases of necessity a portion of the funds appropriated for the current expense of any one of the following institutions, namely: The Anoka State Asylum, the Hastings State Asylum, the Willmar State Asylum, the Fergus Falls State Hospital, the Rochester State Hospital, the St. Peter State Hospital, the School for Feeble-Minded, the Colony for Epileptics, the School for the Blind, the School for the Deaf, the State Public School, the State Training School, the Home School for Girls, the State Reformatory, the State Reformatory for Women, the Sanatorium for Consumptives, and the Hospital for Crippled Children, to the use of any other of the aforesaid institutions; and it is further authorized, by and with the approval of the auditor, to use the sums not exceeding in the aggregate of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), where necessary to supplement the appropriations for current expenses of any of the above named institutions; and

Provided further, that said board may, without such consent and approval of the auditor, use the balance of any appropriation made for a specific purpose at any institution for any other specific purpose in and about such institution after the purpose for which such appropriation was made has been accomplished; and

Provided further, that said board is hereby authorized and empowered to set aside a portion of the current expense fund of any such institution to be used as a diversified labor fund for the introduction and encouragement of such industries as in its judgment may be beneficial to the inmates of such institution.

Sec. 20. State Prison:

The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any money in the state treasury to the credit of the State Prison Revolving Fund to be

expended by the State Board of Control for the purposes specified in this section, to be available at the time designated opposite each item.

Sec. 21. Unexpended balances reappropriated.—The unexpended balances on hand June 30, 1933, in the several appropriations for each and all of the institutions hereinbefore named, the State Board of Control and several divisions and activities of said board are hereby reappropriated for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1934 and June 30, 1935, and where an appropriation is made in this Act and there remains a balance in a previous appropriation made for the same purpose, such balance shall be added to and become a part of such appropriation.

Sec. 22. Executive council may arrange for payment of warrants.—Whenever it becomes necessary, in order to meet the current demands upon the revenue fund for the payment of appropriations, the executive council, may at any time prior to June 30, 1935, make such agreement with banks or other corporations or persons as they may deem advisable or necessary to pay warrants issued against said revenue fund pursuant to any such appropriation prior to the time when the money to meet such appropriation comes into the state treasury, and whenever any warrants so issued are paid for the accommodation of the state the money necessary to pay interest upon the amounts of such warrants from the time when such payment was made until the money to redeem such warrants comes into the state treasury, at the rate agreed upon by the said executive council is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 23. Certain unexpended balances re-appropriated.—The unexpended balance of \$5,500.00 for two cottages at Willmar; and the unexpended balance of \$9,700.00 for receiving hospital at Fergus Falls, together with the unexpended balance of \$5,000.00 for boilers at the Fergus Falls Hospital; and the unexpended balance of \$5,800.00 for new buildings at the St. Peter Hospital; and the unexpended balance of \$5,100.00 for new buildings at the School

for Feeble-Minded at Faribault, Minnesota; and the unexpended balance of \$1,500.00 for the erection of new buildings at the Colony for Epileptics at Cambridge, Minnesota; and the unexpended balance of \$38,000.00 for the installation of a power plant at said Colony for Epileptics; and the unexpended balance of \$4,000.00 for equipment new cottages at Willmar State Asylum; all totaling the sum of \$74,600.00, and all of which appropriations were made at the 1931 legislative session, together with the sum of \$20,000.00, being proceeds from the rock crushing plant at the Rochester State Hospital, are hereby appropriated and reappropriated for the purpose of using said sums of money for the erection and completion of two cottages for inmates at the Colony for Epileptics at Cambridge, Minnesota, in addition to the sum of \$85,400.00 appropriated therefor in Section 9 hereof.

Sec. 24. **Certain salaries reduced.**—All appropriations for current expense in state institutions and for the various items in Section 19 hereof have been made on the basis of salary reductions of twenty per cent (20%) in any and all salaries and wages exceeding the sum of \$1,200 per annum, exclusive of maintenance or maintenance allowances, no salary, however, to be reduced below the sum of \$1,200 per annum. The reductions herein prescribed are to be construed as an emergency provision applicable only to the years ending June 30, 1934 and June 30, 1935. The Board of Control is hereby given authority to reduce salaries as nearly as may be upon an equitable basis and in any manner that it deems best, having regard to the circumstances and experience of the employee involved. Such authority to reduce salaries shall apply to all positions and to all salaries whether fixed by law or otherwise, and whether such salaries are paid from state appropriations, fees, special funds or otherwise, hereby suspending and repealing all laws in conflict with this section.

Sec. 25. This Act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
