

facilitating liquidation, protecting or preserving the assets in his charge, expediting the making of distributions and payment of dividends to depositors and other creditors, providing for the expenses of administration and liquidation and aiding in the reopening or reorganization of such bank, savings bank, trust company or building and loan association, or its merger or consolidation with another bank, savings bank, trust company or building and loan association, or the sale of all of its assets.

The *Commissioner of Banks* shall be under no personal obligation to repay any such loans so made and shall have power to take any and all action necessary or proper to consummate such loan and to provide for the repayment thereof.

Sec. 2. Inconsistent acts repealed.—All laws or parts of laws inconsistent or in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 4—H. F. No. 51

An act to legalize newspapers in certain cases.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Certain newspapers legalized.—No newspaper in this state, which conforms in all respects to the statutes defining a legal newspaper, except that it was not heretofore published for one week at some time since it became a legal newspaper, shall be deprived of its standing as such legal newspaper by reason of such omission; but such newspaper shall be deemed to be a legal newspaper notwithstanding such omission of its publication for one week.

CHAPTER 5—S. F. No. 39

An act to appropriate money for expenses of the State Board of Health.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriation for state board of health.—There is hereby appropriated to the State Board of Health, out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of
