CHAPTER 320—S. F. No. 1679

An act to appropriate money for the conservation and development of the state's natural resources; for maintenance and improvement of State Soldiers' Home; for the maintenance of Minnesota Department, G.A.R.; for maintenance Minnesota Historical Society; for expense of burial of soldiers and sailors; for maintenance, improvement and repairs, Minnesota State Agricultural Society; for county and district agricultural societies; for aid to agricultural agents; for various stock breeders, dairymen's, horticultural and poultry associations and societies; creating Camden State Park and Kaplan Woods State Park, and appropriating money for public parks and additions thereto, for sheriff's per diem and mileage in certain cases; for drainage and highway assessments upon state lands; for vessel tonnage tax; for fees public land collections; for maintenance Sibley House; for maintenance of various semi-state activities; and providing for appropriations to be made out of the game and fish department funds for wolf bounties; for additional maintenance of various state departments and for care, relief and support of the blind; and for other purposes, and prescribing certain reductions and limitations as to the moneys hereby appropriated, and suspending certain provisions of Laws 1925, Chapter 426, and providing for the transfer of certain funds of the game and fish division.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Appropriation for various state purposes.—The sums hereinafter named, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated from any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated for the purposes specified, in the following sections of this act, to be available, when not otherwise stated, for each of the fiscal years ending June 30, 1936, and June 30, 1937.

Provided, that no one association or society will receive an amount greater than the annual premiums paid to exhibitors by them and shall not in any case exceed the sum of \$200.00 to any one county. Provided, further, that any society or association to be entitled to their distributive share of this appropriation shall file annually with the State Auditor, on or before the first day of April of each year, a sworn statement signed by the president or secretary of such association or society, showing the

amount of cash premiums paid during the year to exhibitors, and the amount to be distributed to such society or association from said fund shall be based and determined upon the amount of cash premiums paid out as hereinbefore provided. Provided, further, that except as herein provided, that where there is more than one association in a county the amount allotted to such county, not exceeding \$200.00 aforesaid, shall be distributed to the societies in equal amounts.

Provided, that out of the amounts appropriated by Item 8 hereof, \$1,000 shall be expended yearly to aid in the payment of premiums at exhibitions of turkeys by various associations, no association or society to receive an amount greater than the annual premiums paid to exhibitors by them.

In the event the above described land is acquired for less than the sum above appropriated, the balance of said sum may be expended for reforestation work on the above described land, such reforestation work to be carried on by the Department of Conservation.

Sec. 10. Vessel tonnage tax.—The State Auditor and State Treasurer are hereby authorized to pay to the county treasuries of the several counties of the state, on or before December 1, 1936, and 1937, the amounts due the respective counties as their share of the vessel tonnage tax under the provisions of Mason's Minnesota Statutes 1927, Section 2291.

Sec. 11. Unexpended balances re-appropriated.—The unexpended balances on June 30, 1935, in the several appropriations heretofore made to the activities named in this act are hereby reappropriated and made available for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1936, and June 30, 1937, respectively, for the purposes for which such appropriations were made. Where an appropriation is made in this act and there remains a balance in a previous appropriation for the same purpose, such balance shall be added to and become a part of such appropriation, except as herein otherwise specifically provided.

The unexpended balance in the "Burial of Soldiers and Sailors" fund is hereby reappropriated and made available for the years ending June 30, 1936 and June 30, 1937, provided, however, that no payments shall be made for the burial of soldiers and sailors and/or markers for their graves in any case in which Federal funds are received therefor.

Sec. 12. Salary reduction.—All the foregoing appropriations have been made on the basis of salary reductions of 10 per cent in any and all salaries and wages exceeding \$1320 per annum, no salary, however, to be reduced below the sum of \$1320 per annum. Such reduction is based on rates of salaries prevailing in June, 1933, before any reduction was made under the provisions of Laws 1933, Chapter 426. On such basis the wages of all persons, including those under the jurisdiction and control of the State Board of Control, receiving a salary of \$3000 or more per year shall be reduced so as to be 10 per cent less than the maximum wage schedule for the position for the month of June, 1933, and any provisions of Laws 1935, Chapter 159, inconsistent herewith are repealed.

The various state department heads and activities included herein are hereby given authority to reduce all salaries amounting to less than \$3000 or exceeding \$1320 per annum as nearly as may be upon an equitable basis and in any manner that they deem best, having regard to the circumstances and experience of the employee involved.

The various state department heads and activities included herein, shall determine the salaries to be paid to all their employees as hereinbefore provided, and any classification of

state employees which may have been or shall be made shall not apply, any law to the contrary notwithstanding. Such adjusted salaries shall not in any event exceed the balances, receipts and appropriations made for salaries and wages of the department.

The heads of the various state departments and activities included herein are directed to consult with the Department of Administration and Finance in an effort to bring the various department salaries as near as possible on the same level. Such reductions are to be construed as an emergency measure applicable only to the years ending June 30, 1936, and June 30, 1937.

Such reductions in and authority to reduce and adjust salaries shall apply to all positions and to all salaries, whether fixed by law or otherwise, and whether such salaries are paid from state appropriations, fees, receipts of any kind, special funds or otherwise, hereby suspending and repealing all laws in conflict with this section.

Sec. 13. Publicity representative prohibited.—No state department, bureau or division, whether the same operates on funds appropriated or receipts or fees of any nature whatsoever, including, but not limited to, the Department of Rural Credits, Highway Department and Game and Fish Division, shall use any of such funds for the payment of the salary or expense of a publicity representative. The head of any such department, bureau or division shall be personally liable for funds spent contrary to the provisions hereof. This shall not be construed, however, as preventing any such department, bureau or division, from sending out any bulletins or other publicity required by any state law or necessary for the satisfactory conduct of the business for which such department, bureau or division was created.

Sec. 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 321—H. F. No. 7

An act relating to manufacturing or holding in possession for sale or distribution of the drug cannabin, otherwise commonly known as marijuana, hashish, and other colloquial names, and providing a penalty therefor.
