

pensions and retirement allowances to retired municipal employes pursuant to Laws of 1919, Chapter 522, or said Act as amended, the retirement board is hereby authorized to make loans to the contributing members of such retirement fund in amounts not to exceed fifty per cent of the amount of the salary deductions standing to the credit of any contributor. No loan shall be made except in case of necessity which in the opinion of the board is deemed sufficient to warrant the granting of such loan, nor without the approval of *at least three* members of the board. Loans may be granted in case of lay-off of employes where such lay-off is of indefinite duration and does not amount to a complete separation from the service.

“Repayment of loans in all cases where the employe is still in service shall begin with the month following the making of said loan, and there shall be repaid on such loan each month an amount equal to the regular monthly deduction from the salary of such employe, which deduction for repayment of the loan shall be in addition to the deduction for credit to the retirement fund. In cases where loans are made to employes that have been laid off, the repayment shall begin with the first month in which the employe is reinstated in his regular employment.

“All loans made under this Act shall bear a rate of interest which shall be one-half of one per cent higher than the rate of interest which may be credited by the retirement board to the credit of contributors on their credits from salary deductions.”

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 247—H. F. No. 649

An act to amend Session Laws of 1923, Chapter 419, Section 6, as amended by Laws of 1927, Chapter 125, Section 1, as amended by Laws of 1929, Chapter 152, relating to the salaries, compensation, duties and help of certain county officials in counties having, or which may hereafter have, a population of 380,000 inhabitants or over.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law amended.**—That Session Laws of 1923, Chapter 419, Section 6, as amended by Laws of 1927, Chapter 125, Section 1, as amended by Laws of 1929, Chapter 152 be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"Sec. 6. Salary of sheriff and deputies in certain counties.— The Sheriff shall appoint and employ one chief deputy who shall be paid the sum of *thirty-two hundred seventy* (\$3,270.00) dollars per annum; one assistant chief deputy and Auditor who shall be paid the sum of *twenty-three hundred fifty* (\$2,350.00) dollars per annum; one assistant bookkeeper who shall be paid the sum of *nineteen hundred eighty-seven* (\$1,987.00) dollars per annum; one special deputy who shall be paid the sum of *seventeen hundred sixty-two* (\$1,762.00) dollars per annum; one deputy for tax collections, who shall be paid the sum of *nineteen hundred eighty-seven* (\$1,987.00) dollars per annum; four outside deputies who shall each be paid the sum of *twenty-three hundred fifty* (\$2,350.00) dollars per annum; one deputy for the care of the insane, who shall be paid the sum of *twenty hundred fifteen* (\$2,015.00) dollars per annum; two outside deputies to attend to the service of criminal and other processes, who shall each be paid the sum of *twenty hundred fifteen* (\$2,015.00) dollars per annum; one deputy to attend to mortgage notices, who shall be paid the sum *twenty-four hundred* (\$2,400.00) dollars per annum; one jailer who shall be paid the sum of *nineteen hundred eleven* (\$1,911.00) dollars per annum; four outside criminal deputies who shall each be paid the sum of *twenty-four hundred* (\$2,400.00) dollars per annum; twelve uniformed motorcycle deputies, each deputy to furnish his own motorcycle, maintenance thereof, and uniform, who shall each be paid the sum of *twenty-four hundred ninety* (\$2,490.00) dollars per annum; two assistant jailers who shall each be paid the sum of *seventeen hundred sixty-two* (\$1,762.00) dollars per annum; one matron who shall be paid the sum of *eleven hundred forty-seven* (\$1,147.00) dollars per annum; four night watchmen who shall each be paid the sum of *sixteen hundred twenty-two* (\$1,622.00) dollars per annum; one cook who shall be paid the sum of *fifteen hundred ninety* (\$1,590.00) dollars per annum; two deputies in charge of juries who shall each be paid the sum of *seventeen hundred and ninety* (\$1,790.00) dollars per annum; seven general deputies who shall each be paid the sum of *eighteen hundred and fifty-two* (\$1,852.00) dollars per annum; two outside patrol deputies who shall each be paid the sum of *eighteen hundred and fifty-two* (\$1,852.00) dollars per annum; three general deputies who shall each be paid the sum of *two thousand and seventy* (\$2,070.00) dollars per annum; one stenographer who shall be paid the sum of *seventeen hundred and fifty-two* (\$1,752.00) dollars per annum. The Sheriff shall also appoint and employ as many court room deputies as there are district court judges in and for said county. Said deputies shall attend the court of said judges and perform such duties pertaining to the sheriff's office as the sheriff may require; the compensation of each of said deputies shall be *seventeen hundred and sixty-two* (\$1,762.00) dollars per annum.

Six General Deputies for night duty who shall each be paid the sum of *eighteen hundred and fifty-two* (\$1,852.00) dollars per annum; one female deputy or bailiff to attend on mixed juries, who shall be paid the sum of *fourteen hundred and fifty-five* (\$1,455.00) per annum.

An expense fund of two thousand (\$2,000.00) dollars shall be set aside out of the first moneys received as fees from and after the passage of this Act to be used by the sheriff to meet the current monthly expenses of the office, the money so used to be replaced in said fund at the end of each month when such expense is allowed by the County Board.

Any additional salaries provided for in this Act, unless otherwise provided for, shall be paid out of any money in the county treasury not otherwise appropriated."

CHAPTER 248—S. F. No. 662

An act to amend Session Laws of Minnesota for 1933, Chapter 26, Section 1, relating to salary and compensation of county commissioners in certain counties.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. **Law amended.**—That Session Laws of Minnesota, 1933, Chapter 26, Section 1, be amended so as to read as follows:

"Section 1. **Salary and compensation of county commissioners in certain counties.**—The salary and compensation of county commissioners in any county in this state, now or hereafter having a population of not less than fifty thousand nor more than seventy thousand, according to the last federal census, and consisting of not less than thirty-five nor more than forty-five congressional townships, shall be the sum of nine hundred dollars (\$900.00) per year to each commissioner of said county and in addition thereto each of said commissioners shall receive the sum of three dollars (\$3) per day for each and every day necessarily occupied in the discharge of their official duties while acting on any committee under direction of the board, and five cents per mile each way for every mile necessarily traveled either in attending general or special meetings of the board or upon committee work, but the total amount in addition to said salary of nine hundred dollars (\$900.00) aforesaid allowed to any one commissioner, in any one year, shall not exceed the sum of *five* hundred and
