hereby legalized and validated: provided however, that this act shall not apply to any action or proceeding now pending in any court of this state.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 312— H. F. No. 192

An act to amend Laws 1931, Chapter 407, by increasing the amount of certificates of indebtedness authorized to be issued under authority of said act.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Law amended.—Laws 1931, Chapter 407, Section 3 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

"Sec. 3. Amount of certificates of indebtedness increased.---The proceeds of all certificates of indebtedness issued under the provisions of this Act, all monies received from redemption as hereinafter provided, all monies received as gifts to the State for the purposes of any such project, and all income which may be received from the operation, development, management and use of such projects, including fees received from such licenses and permits, all income which may be received from the sale of all birds, animals, fish and flora therefrom and from the sale of lands and timber thereon owned by the State within such area, other than university, school and swamp lands, State forest lands set apart pursuant to Section 7 of Article 8 of the Constitution and State lands acquired under the system of rural credits, and all monies of the State which may hereafter be transferred thereto under any law of this State shall be paid into the State Treasury and credited to the project to which the same pertain and same are hereby annually appropriated for the purposes thereof; provided that, under the provisions of this act, the aggregate or total of all certificates of indebtedness issued shall not exceed two million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars.

CHAPTER 313-S. F. No. 411

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 17322, relating to the licensing of auctioneers.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Law amended.—That Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 7322, be amended so as to read as follows:

"7322. Auctioneers' licenses.-The county board or auditor may license any voter in its county, or any person from another state, as an auctioneer. Such license shall be issued by the auditor and shall authorize the licensee to conduct the business of an auctioneer in the state of Minnesota for the period of one year. It shall be recorded by the auditor in a book kept for that purpose. Before such license is issued the licensee shall pay into the county treasury a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00), provided, however, that for a nonresident the license fee shall be \$25.00. Provided, that any person may be licensed as an auctioneer for the purpose of making sales of purebred or grade livestock only upon the payment of the fee and the giving of the bond as above provided. Provided, further, that any person resident in an adjoining state which issues auc- ` tioneers' licenses to residents of Minnesota on the same basis as to the residents of such adjoining state, may be licensed as an auctioneer upon payment of the fee required therefor in such adjoining state and giving an approval of a bond as provided in the next succeeding section."

CHAPTER 314-S. F. No. 485

An act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Sections 5872, 5873, 5874, 5875, 5876, 5877, and 5879, relating to the State Board of Electricians repealing certain portions thereof and providing for violations thereof, and adding Sections 5878-A and 5879-A thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Law amended.—That Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5872, be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

"5872. State Board of Electricity-definitions.—That the term "Master Electrician" for the purposes of this act shall be construed to mean a person having the necessary qualifications, training, experience and technical knowledge to properly plan, lay out and supervise the installation of wiring, apparatus and equipment for electric light, heat, power and other purposes in accordance with the standard rules and regulations governing such work.
