RESOLUTION No. 15—S. F. No. 1480

*A concurrent resolution petitioning and requesting Homer S. Cummings, United States Attorney General, and Henry Morgenthau, Jr., Secretary of the United States Treasury, to continue with and complete the construction of a proposed federal prison farm at Sandstone, Minnesota.*

WHEREAS, it has been proposed by the federal government to construct a federal prison farm at Sandstone, Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, bids have been advertised for the work of construction of such federal prison, and

WHEREAS, at the present time there are no federal institutions in the State of Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, the construction of such a federal institution will create employment for many of the citizens of the State of Minnesota, now greatly in need of employment

Now, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, the Senate concurring herein, that we hereby respectfully petition and urge Homer S. Cummings, United States Attorney General, and Henry Morgenthau, Jr., Secretary of the United States Treasury, to continue with and complete the construction of such proposed federal prison farm at Sandstone, Minnesota.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of State of the State of Minnesota is hereby instructed to forward a copy of this resolution to each of the Minnesota Senators and Representatives in Congress.
