rules and regulations for the operation of the state nursing homes at Ah-Gwah-Ching and Oak Terrace and for the admission of patients thereto, and to fix the charges to be made for care therein.

- Sec. 7. [Subd. 7.] Status of employees. Upon execution of the lease referred to herein, the employees of the Glen Lake Sanatorium shall become employees of the state sanatorium or nursing home and blanketed into the classified service of the state, and shall be placed in the proper classifications by the commissioner of civil service with such compensation as such classifications carry. The seniority rights of such employees which exist at the time of transfer shall be retained. Upon assuming state employment each such employee shall be credited with whatever sick leave he still has to his credit as an employee of Glen Lake Sanatorium after application of the severance pay plan of the Hennepin County Sanatorium Commission, but not to exceed thirty days.
- Sec. 8. [Subd. 8.] Employees' retirement fund. The employees of the Glen Lake Sanatorium at the time of transfer may remain under the public employees retirement association and the state shall pay the employer contribution to the public employees retirement association.
- Sec. 9. [Subd. 9.] Appropriations. There is hereby appropriated to the commissioner of administration from funds in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of \$400,000, to be used to remodel, repair and rehabilitate facilities known as Glen Lake Sanatorium.

Section 1. Laws 1935, Chapter 208, Section 1, as amended by Laws 1937, Chapter 132, Section 1, Laws 1937, Chapter 253, Section 1, Laws 1951, Chapter 144, Section 1, and Laws 1955, Chapter 293, Section 1, is amended to read:

Section 1. Eveleth; firemen's retirement pension. In any city of the fourth class having a population in excess of 6,000 and not more than 10,000 and a valuation in excess of \$0,000,000 exclusive of money and eredits, and an area of more than four square miles, In the city of Eveleth, and having which has a Fire Department Relief Association organized under the laws of this state and authorized to pay pensions under Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Sections 1919, 1920, and 3723 to 3728, or any amendments thereof, such association may pay retirement pensions in excess of the amounts so authorized, but not in excess of the following total amounts:

\$100 \$150 per month to each member of the association who shall have reached the age of 55 years and shall have served 20 years or more as a member of the paid municipal fire department in such city. The monthly payments of \$100 \$150 may be increased by adding thereto an amount not exceeding \$5 per month for each year of active duty over 20 years of service before retiring; provided, that no such pen-
