the public ways and to require the driver to permit the inspection of health certificates or permits for the livestock being transported.

When engaged in stopping a truck hauling livestock the enforcement inspector of the livestock sanitary board shall be indentified by a lighted red signal mounted on the right front fender of his automobile, which signal shall have printed on its face the words: "Stop". The automobile shall also be equipped with a flashing amber light of the type used by the Minnesota Highway Patrol and said light shall be mounted on the inside rear deck of the automobile and shall be used when stopping a truck. Such automobile shall have the words "Livestock Sanitary Board" clearly printed on the right front door.

Any such driver who fails to, or refuses to, stop for this inspection when so directed by such inspector shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

CHAPTER 41—H. F. No. 40

An act relating to errors in Minnesota Session Laws; providing for the correction of erroneous, ambiguous, and obsolete statutory references and terminology; amending Laws 1963, Chapter 567, Section 2, Chapter 661, Section 192A.645, and Chapter 753, Article 1, Section 609.37.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

- Section 1. Correction bill. Laws 1963, Chapter 567, Section 2, is amended in the fourth line of the text by striking the reference "Section 6" and inserting in lieu thereof "Section 5".
- Sec. 2. Laws 1963, Chapter 661, Section 192A.645, is amended by striking the reference "Section 192.72" and substituting in lieu thereof the reference "Laws 1963, Chapter 550, Section 5".
- Sec. 3. Laws 1963, Chapter 753, Article 1, Section 609.37, is amended by striking the reference "sections 609.375 and 609.38" and inserting in lieu thereof "section 609.375".
