

subordinate taxing area or by levy of a service charge against the users of such service within the area, or by any combination thereof.

Sec. 10. WITHDRAWAL. Upon receipt of a petition signed by ten percent of the qualified voters within the territory of the subordinate service area requesting the withdrawal of the service area from the provisions of this act, or pursuant to its own resolution, the county board shall make arrangements for the holding of a special election not less than 30 nor more than 90 days after receipt of such a petition within the boundaries of the service area. The question to be submitted and voted upon by the qualified voters within the territory of the service area shall be phrased substantially as follows:

“Shall the subordinate service area heretofore established be withdrawn and the service or services of the county as provided for such service area be discontinued?”

If a majority of those voting on the question favor the withdrawal and discontinuance of such services, the service area shall be deemed withdrawn and the services of the county shall be discontinued upon certification of the vote by the county auditor. The county auditor shall administer the election.

Sec. 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act takes effect when approved by the county board of Carver county, and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

CHAPTER 385—H.F.No.2286

An act relating to Ramsey county; establishing a contingency fund and providing for the borrowing of money for emergencies.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. RAMSEY COUNTY; CONTINGENCY FUND; EMERGENCY BORROWING. The Ramsey county board of commissioners may designate a contingent fund as part of the itemized statement covering all county expenditures for each year. The board may appropriate money from this fund for the purposes that it considers in the best interests of the county.

Sec. 2. **EMERGENCY BORROWING.** To meet a public emergency affecting life, health, property or the public peace, and to the extent that there are no available unappropriated revenues to meet such emergencies, the board may, by unanimous vote, authorize the issuance of emergency notes. These notes may be renewed from time to time but the emergency notes and renewals of any fiscal year shall be paid not later than the last day of the fiscal year next succeeding that in which the emergency appropriation was made. The issuance and payment of these notes is subject to the mill limits on taxing power established by law for Ramsey county.

Sec. 3. **TRANSFER OF APPROPRIATIONS.** The Ramsey county board may during 1971 and thereafter by resolution transfer part or all of any unencumbered appropriation balance or unappropriated funds from one department, office or fund to another department, office or fund.

Sec. 4. **APPROVAL AND COMPLIANCE.** This act shall take effect upon its approval by the Ramsey county board of commissioners and upon compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021.

An act relating to Ramsey county; providing for the commissioner districts and membership; amending Special Laws 1891, Chapter 438, Section 1.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. Special Laws 1891, Chapter 438, Section 1, is amended to read:

Section 1. **RAMSEY COUNTY; COMMISSIONER DISTRICTS.** That the commissioner districts of Ramsey county be and the same are hereby declared to consist of the following territory: Commissioner district number one (1) shall consist of the townships of Rose and Mounds View and the village of New Brighton, and shall elect one (1) commissioner; and commissioner district number two (2) shall consist of the townships of New Canada and White Bear and the villages of White Bear and North St. Paul, and shall elect one (1) commissioner; Commissioner district number one (1) shall consist of

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
