CHAPTER 1—H.F.No.1

*An act relating to the legislature; defining "legislative day"; prescribing meeting times; repealing Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 3.01, Subdivision 1.*

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Minnesota:

Section 1. [3.011] **LEGISLATURE; SESSIONS.** The legislature shall assemble at the seat of government on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January of each odd numbered year; provided, however, that when the first Monday in January falls on January 1, the legislature shall assemble on the first Wednesday after the first Monday in January of that year; and at such other times as it may be called by the governor to meet in extra session.

Sec. 2. [3.012] **LEGISLATIVE DAY.** A legislative day is any day when either house of the legislature is called to order. A legislative day shall commence at seven o'clock a.m. and continue until seven o'clock a.m. of the following calendar day.

Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 1971, Section 3.01, Subdivision 1, is repealed.

Sec. 4. **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This act shall be effective upon final enactment.
