#### CHAPTER 264-S.F.No. 1099

An act relating to natural resources; waiving indirect cost billings to the federal government and other states and provinces in certain circumstances; amending Minnesota Statutes 1986, section 16A.127, by adding a subdivision.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1986, section 16A.127, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

Subd. 9. WAIVER. The commissioner of natural resources need not bill the federal government for the indirect costs of providing emergency fire fighting services, and need not reimburse the general fund for those indirect costs, if the commissioner determines that the emergency fire fighting is in the best interest of the state. The commissioner of natural resources need not bill another state or Canadian province for the indirect costs of providing emergency fire fighting services, and need not reimburse the general fund for those indirect costs, if the other state or Canadian province agrees not to bill the state of Minnesota for the indirect costs of emergency fire fighting services provided by the other state.

#### Sec. 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This act is effective the day following final enactment.

## CHAPTER 265-S.F.No. 1230

An act relating to the Minnesota state historical society; providing for preservation and interpretation of public areas of the state capitol; amending Minnesota Statutes 1986, section 138.67; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 138.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1986, section 138.67, is amended to read:

# 138.67 **DEFINITIONS.**

Subdivision 1. As used in this section and section sections 138.67 and 138.68 and section 2, the terms defined in this section have the meanings given them.

Subd. 2. "Works of art" in all spaces of the capitol, means paintings, portraits, mural decorations, stained glass, statues and busts, bas-relief, ornaments, furniture, plaques, and any other article or structure of a permanent character intended for decoration or commemoration placed in the capitol in 1905 or placed subsequently for historic purposes or decoration.
