1.5	Section 1. AT-RISK YOUTH; APPROPRIATION.
1.6	\$500,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$500,000 in fiscal year 2025 are appropriated from the
1.7	general fund to the commissioner of public safety for a grant to the 8012 Truce Center to
1.8	continue to provide and expand community-based conflict resolution services that encourage
1.9	and support at-risk youth. Center programs supported by these grant funds must include
1.10	programs focused on:
1.11	(1) offering a unique and inclusive approach to rehabilitation and reform by grounding
1.12	youth in cultural roots and perspectives;
1.13	(2) providing education supportive services and mentorship;
1.14	(3) supporting at-risk youth by partnering with local schools to offer behavior intervention
1.15	for at-risk youth;
1.16	(4) mentoring youth ages eight to 18 years old and providing tutoring services, career
1.17	training, and job placement services;
1.18	(5) assisting with chemical dependency counseling for youth struggling with addiction;
1.19	(6) increasing the scope of program mentorship services in high-risk areas to prevent
1.20	violence and realize a decrease in crime and a positive impact on the immediate surrounding
1.21	community where crime rates continue to rise;
