1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 97A.401, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 3. Taking, possessing, and transporting wild animals for certain purposes.
1.8	(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), special permits may be issued without a fee to take,
1.9	possess, and transport wild animals as pets and for scientific, educational, rehabilitative,
1.10	wildlife disease prevention and control, and exhibition purposes. The commissioner shall
1.11	prescribe the conditions for taking, possessing, transporting, and disposing of the wild
1.12	animals.
1.13	(b) A special permit may not be issued to take or possess wild or native deer for
1.14	exhibition, propagation, or as pets.
1.15	(c) Nonresident professional wildlife rehabilitators with a federal rehabilitation permit
1.16	may possess and transport wildlife affected by oil spills.
