1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2017 Supplement, section 122A.26, subdivision 2, is
1.6	amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 2. Exceptions. (a) A person who teaches in a community education program
1.8	which that qualifies for aid pursuant to section 124D.52 shall continue to meet licensure
1.9	requirements as a teacher. A person who teaches in an early childhood and family education
1.10	program which that is offered through a community education program and which that
1.11	qualifies for community education aid pursuant to section 124D.20 or early childhood and
1.12	family education aid pursuant to section 124D.135 shall continue to meet licensure
1.13	requirements as a teacher. A person who teaches in a community education course which
1.14	that is offered for credit for graduation to persons under 18 years of age shall continue to
1.15	meet licensure requirements as a teacher.
1.16	(b) A person who teaches a driver training course which that is offered through a
1.17	community education program to persons under 18 years of age shall be licensed by the
1.18	Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board or be subject to section 171.35. A
