1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 473.386, subdivision 10, is amended to read:
1.8	Subd. 10. Forecasted funding. (a) For purposes of this subdivision, "biennium" and
1.9	"fiscal year" have the meanings given in section 16A.011, subdivisions 6 and 14, respectively.
1.10	(b) In each February and November forecast of state revenues and expenditures under
1.11	section 16A.103, the commissioner of management and budget must incorporate a state
1.12	obligation from the general fund for the annual net costs to the council to implement the
