<u>(i)</u>	describes the symptoms and risk factors for professional burnout and moral injury;
<u>(ii)</u>	addresses the stigma among health care professionals associated with seeking
self-ca	re, including mental health and substance use disorder services;
<u>(iii)</u>	encourages health care professionals to seek support and care for their mental health
and su	bstance use disorder concerns; and
<u>(iv)</u>	helps health care professionals identify risk factors associated with suicide and other
mental	health conditions;
<u>(2)</u>	develop and make available educational resources to support health care professionals
with se	elf-care and resiliency;
<u>(3)</u>	establish priorities for health care organizations to take to prevent and reduce health
care pr	rofessional burnout and moral injury; and
<u>(4)</u>	develop evidence-based measurable outcomes to determine the effectiveness of
strateg	ies taken by health care organizations to prevent and reduce health care professional
burnou	at and moral injury.
