1.6	Section 1. [3.084] LOBBYING ACTIVITIES PROHIBITED.
1.7	(a) A sitting member of the legislature is prohibited from accepting employment with
1.8	or otherwise receiving compensation for services performed from:
1.9	(1) a business whose primary activities involve lobbying, government relations or
1.10	government affairs, or other public policy advocacy or consulting; or
1.11	(2) any other business that employs or contracts with lobbyists, government relations
1.12	or government affairs professionals, or other public policy advocates or consultants, if the
1.13	member's job duties include acting in that capacity or providing direct or indirect consulting,
1.14	advice, or administrative support for that work.
1.15	(b) This prohibition applies regardless of the location where the work of the business is
1.16	substantially conducted or its clients are located.
1.17	(c) The house of representatives and the senate must adopt rules consistent with this
