1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 169.985, is amended to read:
1.7	169.985 TRAFFIC CITATION QUOTA AND CERTAIN SATURATION
1.8	PATROLS AND STING OPERATIONS PROHIBITED.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Quotas prohibited. A law enforcement agency may not order,
1.10	mandate, require, or suggest to a peace officer a quota for the issuance of traffic citations,
1.11	including administrative citations authorized under section 169.999, on a daily, weekly,
1.12	monthly, quarterly, or yearly basis.
1.13	Subd. 2. Seat belt violation saturation patrols and sting operations prohibited.
1.14	Because seat belt violations do not constitute a hazard to the traveling public, a law
1.15	enforcement agency may not conduct a saturation patrol or a sting operation for the
1.16	purpose of detecting drivers operating motor vehicles in violation of section 169.686,
