2.1 the amount of the grant that is sought. The matching requirement is intended to leverage
2.2 the investment of state and community dollars in supporting the efforts of the grantees to

2.4 The commissioner shall provide the application form, procedures for making
2.5 application form, criteria for review of the application, and kinds of contributions in
2.6 addition to cash that qualify as local matching money. No grant to any agency may

2.8 Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 299A.73, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

2.9 Subd. 3. **Grant allocation formula.** (a) Up to ~~one~~ five percent of the appropriations
2.10 to the grants-in-aid to the youth intervention program may be used for a grant to
2.11 the Minnesota Youth Intervention Programs Association for expenses in providing
2.12 collaborative training and technical assistance to community-based grantees of the
2.13 program.

2.14 (b) If a program is terminated or elects not to receive some or all of the grant money
2.15 made available to it, the available grant money shall be redistributed to the remaining
2.16 grantees. If two youth intervention program organizations funded under this section
2.17 merge, the funding may be continued as long as the merged organization maintains both
2.18 programs as originally approved by the commissioner.

2.19 Sec. 4. **APPROPRIATION.**

2.20 \$1,603,300 in fiscal year 2012 and \$1,603,300 in fiscal year 2013 are appropriated
2.21 from the general fund to the commissioner of public safety for youth intervention programs
2.22 under Minnesota Statutes, section 299A.73. This appropriation must be used for grants to
2.23 eligible organizations to provide early intervention youth services in the organizations'
2.24 communities. The appropriations must be included in the department's base budget for
2.25 grants to youth intervention programs. These appropriations are available until expended.
