- 1.2 relating to liquor; modifying city population requirement to qualify for exemption

- 1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 340A.410, subdivision 10, is amended to
- 1.7 read:
- 1.8 Subd. 10. **Temporary licenses; restrictions.** (a) A municipality may not issue more
- 1.9 than three four-day, four three-day, six two-day, or 12 one-day temporary licenses, in any
- 1.10 combination not to exceed 12 days per year, under section 340A.404, subdivision 10, for
- 1.11 the sale of alcoholic beverages to any one organization or registered political committee,
- 1.12 or for any one location, within a 12-month period.
- 1.13 (b) A municipality may not issue more than one temporary license under section
- 1.14 340A.404, subdivision 10, for the sale of alcoholic beverages to any one organization or
- 1.15 registered political committee, or for any one location, within any 30-day period unless the
- 1.16 licenses are issued in connection with an event officially designated a community festival
- 1.17 by the municipality.
- 1.18 This restriction does not apply to a municipality with a population of ~~5,000~~ 10,000 or
- 1.19 fewer people.
- 1.20 (c) A municipality that issues separate temporary wine and liquor licenses may separately
- 1.21 apply the limitations contained in paragraphs (a) and (b) to the issuance of such licenses to
- 1.22 any one organization or registered political committee, or for any one location.

2.1 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.
