1.8	Subdivision 1. Eligibility. A person is eligible to receive educational benefits under
1.9	this section if the person:
1.10	(1) is certified under section 299A.44 and in compliance with this section and rules
1.11	of the commissioner of public safety and the Minnesota Office of Higher Education;
1.12	(2) is enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree or certificate program after
1.13	June 30, 1990, at an eligible Minnesota institution as provided in section 136A.101,
