- 1.2 relating to human services; changing a provision on self-directed caregiver grants;
- 1.3 amending Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256.975, subdivision 12.
- 1.4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.5 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 256.975, subdivision 12, is amended to read:
- 1.6 Subd. 12. **Self-directed caregiver grants.** ~~Beginning on July 1, 2019,~~ The Minnesota
- 1.7 Board on Aging shall, in consultation with area agencies on aging and other community
- 1.8 caregiver stakeholders, administer self-directed caregiver grants to support at-risk family
- 1.9 caregivers of older adults or others eligible under the Older Americans Act of 1965, United
- 1.10 States Code, title 42, chapter 35, sections 3001 to 3058ff, to sustain family caregivers in
- 1.11 the caregivers' roles so older adults can remain at home longer. ~~The board shall give priority~~
- 1.12 ~~to consumers referred under section 256.975, subdivision 7, paragraph (d)~~ The board shall
- 1.13 submit by January 15, 2022, and each January 15 thereafter, a progress report on the
- 1.14 self-directed caregiver grants program to the chairs and ranking minority members of the
- 1.15 senate and house of representatives committees and divisions with jurisdiction over human
- 1.16 services. The progress report must include metrics on the use of the grant program.
