A law 1.10 enforcement agency is prohibited from using the number of traffic or administrative citations 1.11 issued, the number of traffic stops made, or traffic enforcement activity by a peace officer 1.12 as criteria to evaluate the peace officer's performance. 1.13 1.14 Sec. 2.
