1.10	with academic deficiencies who are placed into college-level coursework.
1.11	Subd. 2. Establishment. (a) The board shall establish at each campus a
1.12	supplemental academic instruction program.
1.13	(b) The program must:
1.14	(1) allow a student to enroll in any entry-level credit-bearing college-level course
1.15	while receiving supplemental academic instruction on the same subject and during the
1.16	same term as the course in which the student is enrolled;
1.17	(2) provide a student with targeted support related to the credit-bearing college-level
1.18	course including, but not limited to, tutoring and directed group study time, to increase the
1.19	student's understanding of the college-level coursework;
1.20	(3) provide the supplemental academic instruction at no cost to the student; and
1.21	(4) minimize the use of developmental noncredit courses for students in need
1.22	of additional academic support.
1.23	Subd. 3. Eligibility. The board shall establish guidelines to determine student
