| 1.8 | are not peace officers, the commissioner, at the request of a majority of either the peace |
| 1.9 | officers or the other essential employees within the unit, shall divide the unit into two |
| 1.10 | separate appropriate units, one for the peace officers and one for the other essential |
| 1.11 | employees. |
| 1.12 | (b) The commissioner shall not designate an appropriate unit which includes both peace |
| 1.13 | officers, subject to licensure under sections 626.84 to 626.863, who have a rank of sergeant |
| 1.14 | or above and peace officers, subject to licensure under sections 626.84 to 626.863, who |
| 1.15 | have a rank below sergeant. This paragraph applies to peace officers employed by cities of |
| 1.16 | the first class with a population over 200,000. |
