1.7	(a) A person may not set, place, or operate, except as a waterset, a body-gripping or
1.8	eonibear-type trap on public lands and waters that has a maximum jaw opening when set
1.9	greater than 6-1/2 inches and less than 7-1/2 inches measured from the inside edges of the
1.10	body-gripping portions of the jaws, unless:
1.11	(1) the trap is in a baited or unbaited enclosure and the trap trigger is recessed seven
1.12	inches or more from the top and frontmost portion of the open end of the enclosure;
1.13	(2) no bait, lure, or other attractant is placed within 20 feet of the trap; or
1.14	(3) the trap is elevated at least three feet above the surface of the ground or snowpack
1.15	(b) A person may not set, place, or operate a body-gripping trap, except as a

waterset, within 150 feet of the center line of a public road or public trail.
