Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 144.672, subdivision 1, is amended to read: 1.6 Subdivision 1. Rule authority. The commissioner of health shall collect cancer incidence 1.7 information, analyze the information, and conduct special studies designed to determine 1.8 the potential public health significance of an increase in cancer incidence. 1.9 The commissioner shall adopt rules to administer the system, collect information, and 1.10 distribute data. The rules must include, but not be limited to, the following: 1.11 (1) the type of data to be reported including whether an individual is or was a full-time 1.12 or volunteer firefighter and the name of the fire department where the individual worked; 1.13 1.14 (2) standards for reporting specific types of data; (3) payments allowed to hospitals, pathologists, and registry systems to defray their 1.15 costs in providing information to the system; 1.16 (4) criteria relating to contracts made with outside entities to conduct studies using data 1.17 collected by the system. The criteria may include requirements for a written protocol outlining

of the study, peer review by other scientists, the methods and facilities to protect the privacy

of the data, and the qualifications of the researcher proposing to undertake the study; and
