1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 97B.903, is amended to read:
1.6	97B.903 USE OF BODY-GRIPPING TRAPS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Placing traps. A person may not set, place, or operate, except as a waterset
1.8	water set, a body-gripping or conibear-type trap on public lands and waters that has a
1.9	maximum jaw opening when set greater than $\frac{6-1}{2}$ inches and less than 7-1/2 inches
1.10	measured from the inside edges of the body-gripping portions of the jaws, unless:
1.11	(1) the trap is in a baited or unbaited an enclosure with any opening no greater than 50
1.12	square inches, and the trap trigger is recessed seven inches or more from the top and
1.13	frontmost portion, sides, and bottom of the open end any opening of the enclosure;
1.14	(2) the trap is in an enclosure with only one entrance that faces the ground and that is
1.15	no more than six inches from the ground, and the trap trigger is recessed four inches from
1.16	the opening;
1.17	(2) (3) no bait, lure, or other attractant is placed within 20 100 feet of the trap, the
1.18	maximum jaw opening when set is no more than 6-1/2 inches as measured from the inside
1.19	edges of the body-gripping portions of the jaws, and no part of the body-gripping surface
1.20	is more than eight inches above the ground; or
1.21	(3) (4) the trap is elevated at least three four feet above the surface of the ground or

Subd. 2. Road right-of-way. (a) A person may not set, place, or operate a body-gripping
trap with a maximum jaw opening when set of more than 6-1/2 inches as measured from
the inside edges of the body-gripping portions of the jaws in the road right-of-way within
500 feet of a building occupied by a human or livestock without written permission of the
occupant or landowner.

- (b) A person may not set, place, or operate a body-gripping trap that has a maximum jaw opening when set of greater than 5-1/2 inches when measured from the inside edges of the body-gripping portions of the jaws in or within three feet of the opening of a six-foot-wide or smaller culvert in the road right-of-way.
- 2.10 (c) Paragraphs (a) and (b) do not apply to a completely submerged water set.
