1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:			
1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 169.222, subdivision 4, is amended to read:			
1.6	Subd. 4. <b>Riding rules.</b> (a) Every person operating a bicycle upon a roadway <u>and</u>			
1.7	proceeding at less than the normal speed of traffic at the time and place, and under the			
1.8	existing conditions, shall ride in the right-hand lane then available for traffic or shall			
1.9	ride as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway except under			
1.10	any of the following situations:			
1.11	(1) when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction;			
1.12	(2) when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private road or driveway;			
1.13	(3) when reasonably necessary to avoid conditions, including fixed or moving			
1.14	objects, vehicles, pedestrians, animals, surface hazards, $\frac{1}{2}$ narrow width lanes, $\frac{1}{2}$ that $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ land $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ land $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ land $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ land

1.17	(4) when operating on the shoulder of a roadway or in a bicycle lane.			
1.18	(b) If a bicycle is traveling on a shoulder of a roadway, the bicycle shall travel in the			
1.19	same direction as adjacent vehicular traffic.			
1.20	(c) Persons riding bicycles upon a roadway or shoulder shall not ride more than two			
1.21	abreast and shall not impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic and, on a			
1.22	laned roadway, shall ride within a single lane.			

(d) A person operating a bicycle upon a sidewalk, or across a roadway or shoulder

on a crosswalk, shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give an audible

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signal when necessary before overtaking and passing any pedestrian. No person shall ride a bicycle upon a sidewalk within a business district unless permitted by local authorities. Local authorities may prohibit the operation of bicycles on any sidewalk or crosswalk under their jurisdiction.

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- (e) An individual operating a bicycle or other vehicle on a bikeway shall leave a safe distance when overtaking a bicycle or individual proceeding in the same direction on the bikeway, and shall maintain clearance until safely past the overtaken bicycle or individual.
- (f) A person lawfully operating a bicycle on a sidewalk, or across a roadway or shoulder on a crosswalk, shall have all the rights and duties applicable to a pedestrian under the same circumstances.
- (g) A person may operate an electric-assisted bicycle on the shoulder of a roadway, on a bikeway, or on a bicycle trail if not otherwise prohibited under section 85.015, subdivision 1d; 85.018, subdivision 2, paragraph (d); or 160.263, subdivision 2, paragraph (b), as applicable.
- (h) Upon approaching an intersection where right turns are permitted and there is a dedicated right-turn lane, a bicyclist may ride on the left-hand portion of the dedicated right-turn lane even if the bicyclist does not subsequently turn right and does not intend to turn right.
