1.8	Subdivision 1. Centralized tracking. The commissioner must maintain a			
1.9	centralized tracking list of new agency projects estimated to cost more than \$100,000 that			
1.10	are paid for from the general fund.			
1.11	Subd. 2. New agency project. (a) For purposes of this section, a "new agency			
1.12	project" means:			
1.13	(1) any new agency program or activity with more than \$100,000 in funding from			
1.14	the general fund; and			
1.15	(2) any preexisting agency program or activity with an increase of \$100,000 or more			
1.16	above the base level in general fund support.			
1.17	(b) For purposes of this section, a new agency project does not include:			
1.18	(1) general aid programs for units of local government, or entitlement programs			
1.19	providing assistance to individuals; or			
1.20	(2) a new program or activity or increase in a program or activity that is mandated			
1.21	<u>by law.</u>			
1.22	Subd. 3. Transparency requirements. The centralized tracking list maintained by			
1.23	the commissioner must report the following for each new agency project:			
1.24	(1) name of the agency and title of the project;

2.2	(3) the extent to which the project has been implemented; and				
2.3	(4) the amount of money that has been spent on the project.
