4.25	average rate for fall 2014 is calculated with
4.26	the graduation rates reported in fall 2012,
4.27	2013, and 2014;
4.28	(2) increase by at least two percent the
4.29	total number of undergraduate STEM
4.30	degrees, averaged over three years, conferred
4.31	systemwide by the University of Minnesota
4.32	reported in fiscal year 2016 over fiscal year
4.33	2014. The averaged number for fiscal year

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5.1	2014 is calculated with the fiscal year 2012,
5.2	2013, and 2014 numbers;
5.3	(3) increase by at least one percent the
5.4	four-year undergraduate graduation rate at
5.5	the University of Minnesota reported in fall
5.6	2016 over fall 2014. The average rate for
5.7	fall 2014 is calculated with the graduation
5.8	rates reported in fall 2012, 2013, and 2014.
5.9	The averaged number for fiscal year 2014 is
5.10	calculated with the fiscal year 2012, 2013,
5.11	and 2014 numbers;
5.12	(4) for fiscal year 2016, reallocate
5.13	\$15,000,000 of administrative costs. The
5.14	Board of Regents is requested to redirect
5.15	those funds to invest in direct mission
5.16	activities, stem growth in cost of attendance,
5.17	and to programs that benefit students; and
5.18	(5) increase licensing disclosures by three
5.19	percent for fiscal year 2016 over fiscal year
5.20	2015.
5.21	By August 1, 2015, the Board of Regents and
5.22	the Office of Higher Education must agree on
5.23	specific numerical indicators and definitions
5.24	for each of the five goals that will be used to
5.25	demonstrate the University of Minnesota's
5.26	attainment of each goal. On or before April
5.27	1, 2016, the Board of Regents must report
5.28	to the legislative committees with primary
5.29	jurisdiction over higher education finance
5.30	and policy the progress of the University of
5.31	Minnesota toward attaining the goals. The
5.32	appropriation base for the next biennium shall
5.33	include appropriations not made available
5.34	under this subdivision for failure to meet
5.35	performance goals. All of the appropriation

6.11	The legislature finds that the University of Minnesota disposed of aborted fetuses in
6.12	a manner inconsistent with the legislative intent of Minnesota Statutes, section 145.1621.
6.13	Sec. 5. APPROPRIATION; UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA.
6.14	(a) Subject to paragraph (b), \$14,000,000 in fiscal year 2018 is appropriated from
6.15	the general fund to the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota to:
6.16	(1) increase the medical school's research capacity;
6.17	(2) improve the medical school's ranking in National Institutes of Health funding;
6.18	(3) ensure the medical school's national prominence by attracting and retaining
6.19	world-class faculty, staff, and students;
6.20	(4) invest in physician training programs in rural and underserved communities; and
6.21	(5) translate the medical school's research discoveries into new treatments and
6.22	cures to improve the health of Minnesotans.
6.23	(b) This appropriation is available only upon certification by the Board of Regents to
6.24	the commissioner of management and budget that the fetal tissue research center funded
6.25	in Laws 2015, chapter 69, article 1, section 5, subdivision 2, has been established and is
6.26	operational, consistent with the requirements of that subdivision. If the appropriation
6.27	provided by this section is made available to the Board of Regents, the amount of the
6.28	appropriation is added to the board's base beginning in fiscal year 2019.
