The board of directors shall hire staff for the Agricultural Utilization 2.13 Research Institute. Persons employed by the Agricultural Utilization Research Institute 2.14 are not state employees and may participate in state retirement, deferred compensation, 2.15 insurance, or other plans that apply to state employees generally and are subject to 2.16 regulation by the state Campaign Finance and Public Disclosure Board. The salary and 2.17 the value of all other forms of compensation of the executive director must not exceed 80 2.18 percent of the salary of the commissioner of agriculture. Any institute-paid staff travel 2.19

2.20 <u>outside of the state must be preapproved by the board of directors.</u>

2.21 Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 116V.01, subdivision 10, is amended to read: Subd. 10. Meetings. The board of directors shall meet at least twice eight times 2.22 each year and may hold additional meetings upon giving notice in accordance with the 2.23 bylaws of the institute. Board meetings are subject to chapter 13D, except subdivision 2.24 10 section 13D.01, subdivision 6, as it pertains to financial information, business plans, 2.25 income and expense projections, customer lists, market and feasibility studies, and trade 2.26 secret information as defined by section 13.37, subdivision 1, paragraph (b). The institute 2.27 must post approved meeting minutes on the institute's Web site. The institute must post 2.28 an audio recording of each meeting on the institute's Web site no later than the day 2.29 following the meeting. 2.30

- 2.32 (a) The terms of all Agricultural Utilization Research Institute board members
  2.33 serving on the date of final enactment, other than the chairs or designees of the legislative

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committees with jurisdiction over agriculture finance, expire June 30, 2014. Effective July
1, 2014, new board members must be appointed as provided in this act.
(b) Notwithstanding the four-year terms specified in Minnesota Statutes, section
116V.01, subdivision 2, to establish staggered terms henceforth the initial appointees
required under this act serve terms of the following lengths:
(1) one of the representatives of a statewide farm organization serves a two-year
term, ending June 30, 2016, and the other representative of a statewide farm organization
serves a four-year term ending June 30, 2018. If the representatives are not able to agree
which person serves the four-year term, this shall be determined by lot;
(2) the representative of a statewide farm organization representing sustainable and
community-scale agricultural producers serves a four-year term, ending June 30, 2018;
(3) the representative of agribusiness appointed by the speaker of the house of
representatives serves a two-year term ending June 30, 2016, and the representative of
agribusiness appointed by the senate Committee on Rules and Administration serves
a four-year term, ending June 30, 2018;
(4) the representatives of commodity promotion councils appointed by the speaker
of the house of representatives and the senate Committee on Rules and Administration,
respectively, serve a two-year term ending June 30, 2016. The representative of a
commodity promotion council appointed by the governor serves a four-year term, ending
June 30, 2018; and
(5) the representative of organized labor appointed by the speaker of the house of
representatives serves a four-year term ending June 30, 2018, and the representative of
organized labor appointed by the senate Committee on Rules and Administration serves a
two-year term, ending June 30, 2016.
