1.10	may annually apply by August 1 for the preceding fiscal year to the commissioner of public
1.11	safety for reimbursement to help defray a portion of its total costs of complying with this
1.12	section. The commissioner shall provide an equal pro rata share reimbursement to the public
1.13	employer out of the public safety officer's benefit account based on the availability of funds
1.14	for each eligible officer, firefighter, and qualifying dependents. Individual shares must not
1.15	exceed the actual costs of providing coverage under this section by a public employer.
