1.9	(b) "Electronic message" means a self-contained piece of digital communication that is
1.10	designed or intended to be transmitted between physical devices. An electronic message
1.11	includes, but is not limited to: e-mail; a text message; an instant message; a command or
1.12	request to access a web page; a voice mail message; a transmitted image; transmitted video
1.13	content, including through video calling; transmitted gaming data; and other data transmitted
1.14	using a commonly recognized electronic communications protocol. An electronic message
1.15	does not include: voice or audio data transmitted as a result of making a phone call; data
1.16	transmitted between a motor vehicle and a wireless communications device located in the

2.4	(d) For purposes of this section, a motor vehicle is not in motion or a part of traffic if
