1.8	Subd. 5. Benefit amount. (a) On approval by the commissioner of eligibility for
1.9	the program, the applicant shall be awarded, on a funds-available basis, the educational
1.10	assistance under the program for use at any time according to program rules at any
1.11	eligible institution.
1.12	(b) The amount of educational assistance in any semester or term for an eligible
1.13	person must be determined by subtracting from the eligible person's cost of attendance the
1.14	amount the person received or was eligible to receive in that semester or term from:
1.15	(1) the federal Pell Grant;

1.17	(3) any federal military or veterans educational benefits including but not limited

student must not exceed the following:

2.1	(1) \$1,000 per semester or term of enrollment;
2.2	(2) \$3,000 per state fiscal year; and
2.3	(3) \$10,000 in a lifetime.
2.4	For a part-time student, the amount of educational assistance must not exceed
2.5	\$500 per semester or term of enrollment. For the purpose of this paragraph, a part-time
2.6	undergraduate student is a student taking fewer than 12 credits or the equivalent for a
2.7	semester or term of enrollment and a part-time graduate student is a student considered
2.8	part time by the eligible institution the graduate student is attending. The minimum award
2.9	for undergraduate and graduate students is \$50 per term.
