| 1.9               | (b) "Integrated roadside vegetation management" means an approach to right-of-way  |
| 1.10              | maintenance that combines a variety of techniques with sound ecological principles to  |
| 1.11              | establish and maintain safe, healthy, and functional roadsides. Integrated roadside vegetation   |
| 1.12              | management includes but is not limited to judicious use of herbicides, spot mowing,  |
| 1.13              | biological control, prescribed burning, mechanical tree and brush removal, erosion prevention  |
| 1.14              | and treatment, and prevention and treatment of other right-of-way disturbances.  |

| 2.24 | (a) \$ in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner      |
| 2.25 | of transportation for the highways for habitat program under Minnesota Statutes, section  |
| 2.26 | 160.2325. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until June 30, 2024. This      |
| 2.27 | appropriation may be used to match federal funds made available for this purpose.         |
| 2.28 | (b) By January 15, 2025, the commissioner of transportation must submit a report to the   |
| 2.29 | chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees and divisions with      |
