1.7	Subd. 3. <b>Local contracts.</b> Effective January 1, 1988, (a) The county board shall review
1.8	all proposed county agreements, grants, or other contracts related to mental health services
1.9	for funding from any local, state, or federal governmental sources. Contracts with service
1.10	providers must:
1.11	(1) name the commissioner as a third-party beneficiary;
1.12	(2) identify monitoring and evaluation procedures not in violation of the Minnesota
