Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 290.0674, subdivision 2, is amended to read: 1.7 Subd. 2. Limitations. (a) For claimants with income not greater than \$33,500 18 \$50,000, the maximum credit allowed for a family is \$1,000 \$1,500 multiplied by 1.9 the number of qualifying children in kindergarten through grade 12 in the family. Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 290.0674, is amended by adding a subdivision to read:

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Subd. 6. Inflation adjustment. The income threshold at which the maximum credit begins to be reduced in subdivision 2 must be adjusted for inflation. The commissioner shall adjust the income threshold by the percentage determined pursuant to the provisions of section 1(f) of the Internal Revenue Code, except that in section 1(f)(3)(B), the word "2014" shall be substituted for the word "1992." For 2016, the commissioner shall then determine the percent change from the 12 months ending on August 31, 2014, to the 12 months ending on August 31, 2014, to the 12 months ending August 31, 2014, to the 12 months ending on August 31 of the year preceding the taxable year. The income threshold as adjusted for inflation must be rounded to the nearest \$10 amount. If the amount ends in \$5, the amount is rounded up to the nearest \$10 amount. The determination of the commissioner under this subdivision is not a rule under the Administrative Procedure Act.
