1.1 1.2	A bill for an act relating to education; creating a vision therapy pilot project; appropriating money.
1.3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

## Section 1. **VISION THERAPY PILOT PROJECT.**

Subdivision 1. **Establishment.** A three-year grant program is established to fund vision therapy pilot projects in up to four school districts.

Subd. 2. Pilot project. In each year of the pilot project, second and third grade students identified by a set of criteria by the pilot school shall be admitted into the pilot study. Identified students shall have a comprehensive eye examination with written standard requirements of testing. Students identified with a diagnosis of convergence insufficiency must undergo a vision efficiency evaluation by a licensed optometrist or ophthalmologist trained in the evaluation of learning-related vision problems. The results of this examination shall determine whether a student will qualify for neuro-optometric vision therapy funded by the grant. The parent or guardian of a student who qualifies for the pilot program under this paragraph may submit a written notification to the school opting the student out of the program. Guidelines must be established to provide quality standards and measures to ensure an appropriate diagnosis and treatment plan that is consistent with the convergence insufficiency treatment trial study.

Subd. 3. **Application.** The applicant school district must submit a plan to the commissioner of education in the form and manner the commissioner determines. A charter school is not eligible to apply. The application must include:

Subd	Application review; grant awards. (a) Grant money must be paid to the
recipient d	istricts in the 2015-2016, 2016-2017, and 2017-2018 school years.
<u>(b) T</u>	The grant is awarded for a three-year time period.
(c) T	he commissioner shall oversee the grant distribution.
(d) A	a grant shall be awarded to Independent School District No. 12, Centennial,
provided t	he district meets the application requirements in subdivision 3.
<u>(e)</u> A	grant shall be awarded to an applicant district in each of the following
geographic	e areas:
<u>(1) a</u>	district with its administrative offices located in a city of the first class;
(2) a	district, not including Independent School District No. 12, Centennial, with
ts adminis	strative offices located in Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, or
Washingto	n County, but not in a city of the first class; and
