1.6	Section 1. [136A.123] ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE GRANTS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Eligibility for grants. An applicant is eligible to be considered for
1.8	an academic excellence grant if the applicant:
1.9	(1) is a resident of the state of Minnesota;
1.10	(2) is a graduate of a secondary school or its equivalent, or is 17 years or over,
1.11	and has met all the requirements for admission as a student to an eligible postsecondary
1.12	institution operated by the Board of Regents of the University of Minnesota or the Board
1.13	of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities;
1.14	(3) is not in default, as defined by the office, of any federal or state educational loan;
1.15	(4) has a family adjusted gross income of less than \$100,000;
1.16	(5) plans to enroll in or is currently enrolled in a four-year degree program; and
