## Section 1. ST. LOUIS COUNTY HERITAGE AND ARTS CENTER.

Subdivision 1. Appropriation. \$4,000,000 is appropriated from the bond proceeds fund to the commissioner of employment and economic development for a grant to St. Louis County for asset preservation of the St. Louis County Heritage and Arts Center, also known as the Depot, in Duluth. The asset preservation work includes predesign, design, construction, and renovation work for replacement of or improvements to mechanical, electrical, heating, ventilating, and air conditioning systems; life-safety elements of the building; and exterior building envelope integrity. This appropriation is available when the commissioner of management and budget determines that sufficient resources have been committed to complete the project, as required by Minnesota Statutes, section 16A.502.

Subd. 2. **Bond sale.** To provide the money appropriated in this section from the bond proceeds fund, the commissioner of management and budget shall sell and issue bonds of the state in an amount up to \$4,000,000 in the manner, upon the terms, and with the effect prescribed by Minnesota Statutes, sections 16A.631 to 16A.675, and by the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, sections 4 to 7.
