CONTRACTOR RECOVERY FUND PROJECTS. 1.5 (a) In fiscal years 2020 and 2021 the commissioner of labor and industry shall utilize 1.6 funds in the contractor recovery fund for a statewide consumer awareness campaign 1.7 highlighting the importance of hiring licensed contractors as well as the consequences of 1.8 1.9 hiring unlicensed contractors. (b) In fiscal years 2020 and 2021 the commissioner of labor and industry shall utilize 1.10 funds in the contractor recovery fund for the development and implementation of continuing 1.11 education relating to financial management and financial obligations of licensed residential 1.12 building contractors. 1.13 (c) In fiscal years 2020 and 2021 the commissioner of labor and industry shall utilize 1.14 funds in the contractor recovery fund for a code administration, builder licensure, and 1.15 subcontractor registration research project to be implemented in one or more code or 1.16 non-code enforced local government jurisdictions. policy and finance. At a minimum, the report must summarize the research project activity,
review results, and identify steps for increasing statewide use of licensed contractors and
local government code administration. The commissioner shall consult with members of
the building officials associations, builders associations, and local government units to
contribute to the report.
