1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 340A.601, subdivision 5, is amended to
1.6	read:
1.7	Subd. 5. Issuance of licenses to private persons. A city owning and operating a
1.8	municipal liquor store may issue on-sale liquor licenses to hotels, clubs, and restaurants. A
1.9	city issuing on-sale licenses under this subdivision may continue to operate the municipal
1.10	liquor store or may resume operation of a municipal liquor store previously discontinued.
1.11	The number of on-sale licenses issued under this section by a city is governed by
1.12	section 340A.413.
1.13	A city may not issue licenses under this section, other than a license issued to a
1.14	elub under section 340A.404, subdivision 1, clause (4), until authorized by the voters of
1.15	the city voting on the question at a special election called for that purpose. All other
1.16	provisions of this chapter, applying to the licensing of intoxicating liquor for on-sale or
1.17	off-sale, apply to a city with a municipal liquor store under this section. If a city denies
1.18	a retail license under this chapter to a private interest, it must be for a reason consistent
1.19	with section 340A.402, or other law. The city may not deny a license on the grounds that
1.20	it will provide competition to the municipal liquor store.
1.21	Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 340A.601, subdivision 7, is amended to read:

1.22 Subd. 7. Notice of intent. A city which has issued retail intoxicating liquor
1.23 licenses may not establish a municipal liquor store until one year after publishing a

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- 2.1 notice of its intention in the city's legal newspaper. The city must provide in the notice
- 2.2 if the municipality will be engaging in the sale of intoxicating liquor to the exclusion of
- 2.3 all private interests.
